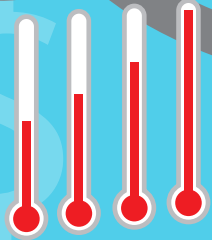


HOSPITAL DECISION MAKERS PLACE SUPPLY CHAIN AS TOP PRIORITY

Survey shows that there is still opportunity to unlock more value

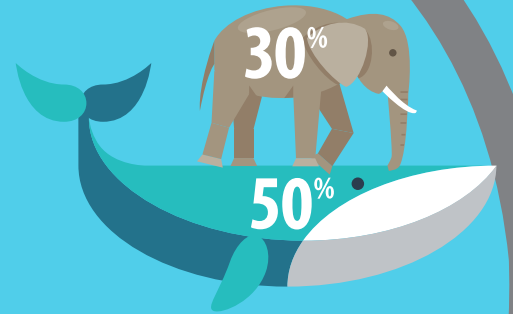
PROBLEM



The increasingly **HIGH COST** of supplies is one of the biggest problems facing healthcare systems today.



85% of respondents anticipate revenue will **DECLINE** through the next year.



The supply chain is the **2ND LARGEST EXPENSE** at 30 percent for healthcare providers, after employee salaries and benefits at 50 percent.**



Annual waste is estimated at **\$5 BILLION** in high-value medical devices.*

Only **1 in 3** hospital decision makers rate the management of their hospital's overall supply chain as "very effective."

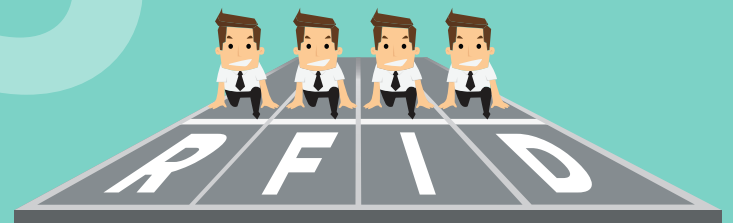


Advancements in supply chain technology already widely used in other industries can **DELIVER INSIGHT** and analytics to support transparent, data-driven decisions.
